THE SERMON The Very Rev. Dr. Warren Leibovitch

THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became

incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

C. S. Lewis Class

We will continue our discussion of Lewis' essay Transposition on Monday, November 28. Join us in the Conference Room at 2 PM for a lively and in-depth examination of this important work of Christian apologetics. You're welcome to join the class even if you haven't read the essay (we're very tolerant of those who haven't done their homework). This past week, on Tuesday, Clive Staples Lewis was, as he is every year, remembered in the Episcopal Calendar. Lewis died November 22, 1963, the same day-and at almost the same time-that John F. Kennedy and Aldous Huxley (author of the novel Brave New World) died, the former by assassination and the latter by an overdose of LSD. The book Between Heaven and Hell, by author and philosopher Peter Kreeft, imagines the three—Lewis, Kennedy, and Huxley-getting together in limbo (actually, they don't know where they are) to discuss the idea of eternity, heaven, and hell, Christianity, secularism and Buddhism.
