THE LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH

Officiant Our King and Savior now draws near. *People O come, let us adore him. Alleluia!*

Officiant We light a fourth candle on our Advent Wreath—the candle of love. Its light reminds us of the love God has for each of us.

(The fourth candle is lighted.)

Let us pray. Loving God, we thank you for your gift of love shown to us perfectly in Jesus Christ our Lord. Help us to remember that love is patient, kind, and envies no one. Love is never boastful or conceited, rude or selfish; love is not quick to take offense, it keeps no record of wrongs, it does not gloat over other people's troubles, but rejoices in the right, the good, and the true. There is nothing that love cannot face; there is no limit to its faith, to its hope, to its endurance. Love never ends.

People To you, O Lord, we lift up our souls: In you, O God, we trust.

THE FIRST LESSON (please be seated)

A Reading from the Second Book of the Prophet Samuel (7:1-11, 16).

When the king was settled in his house, and the LORD had given him rest from all his enemies around him, the king said to the prophet Nathan, "See now, I am living in a house of cedar, but the ark of God stays in a tent." Nathan said to the king, "Go, do all that you have in mind; for the LORD is with you."

But that same night the word of the LORD came to Nathan: Go and tell my servant David: Thus says the LORD: Are you the one to build me a house to live in? I have not lived in a house since the day I brought up the people of Israel from Egypt to this day, but I have been moving about in a tent and a tabernacle. Wherever I have moved about among all the people of Israel, did I ever speak a word with any of the tribal leaders of Israel, whom I commanded to shepherd my people Israel, saying, "Why have you not built me a house of cedar?" Now therefore thus you shall say to my servant David: Thus says the Lord of hosts: I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep to be prince over my people Israel; and I have been with you wherever you went, and have cut off all your enemies from before you; and I will make for you

a great name, like the name of the great ones of the earth. And I will appoint a place for my people Israel and will plant them, so that they may live in their own place, and be disturbed no more; and evildoers shall afflict them no more, as formerly, from the time that I appointed judges over my people Israel; and I will give you rest from all your enemies. Moreover the LORD declares to you that the LORD will make you a house. Your house and your kingdom shall be made sure forever before me; your throne shall be established forever.

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called I Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. THE NICENE CREED

Pe believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. Musical Moments

This morning you are invited to join the Parish Choir in singing two important liturgical pieces: the Trisagion and the Agnus DEI. The TRISAGION (Greek: pronounced tree-SAH-ghee-own) is often sung—in the seasons of Advent and Lent—in place of the GLORIA IN EXCELSIS DEO (Glory to God in the highest), right after the opening sentences (page 2). It is traditionally sung three times. TRISAGION comes from the Eastern liturgical tradition, as does Kyrie eleison (Lord, have mercy; also Greek and often sung during Lent in place of the GLORIA). The AGNUS DEI (Lamb of God) stems from the Latin tradition; it is sung immediately after the Celebrant 'breaks' the bread (thus it is known as a 'fraction' anthem) and before the invitation to communion (page 9). The musical settings we will be singing were written by the distinguished American composer David Hurd. The tunes are not unfamiliar, so do join in. (Of course you then run the risk of being invited to join the Parish Choir.) Gerald
