A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles (1:15-17, 21-26).

In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred twenty persons) and said, "Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus—for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry. So one of the men who have accompanied us during all

THE SERMON The Very Rev. Dr. Warren Leibovitch

THE NICENE CREED
