Words From Warren . . .

For those who were unable to attend the Annual Meeting on January 29, below is a portion of my *Report/Charge to Vestry:

February is a transition month in which we move from the Christmas and New Year's celebrations, through the season of Epiphany, to Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent with its journey to the Cross and Easter.

Up in the Northern States and in Canada, February tends to be a cold dark month when people are waiting for spring with great anticipation. It is a transition month between winter and spring.

*Life is full of transitions. We move from our family home to college or university, or from home to a job in a new city or town. Military families know what it means to move around, as do clergy. Excitement and anxiety all wrapped up together.

Transitions bring with them much anticipation, but anything with change can stir up concerns. Even happy times such as getting married or expecting a baby are times of change and flux that can create anxiety.

Covid19 still rears its ugly head. Two of my sisters and their families recently had Covid19, as have several parishioners, but thankfully most who catch it today get through it without serious problems. We continue to move through the pandemic.

Covid19 has changed the way we do church and gather socially. We are left with an invisible scar reminding us of three difficult years that dealt with isolation, illness and even the death of friends and family.

We continue to be in a time of transition at St. Francis in the Valley. We have a smaller staff and only one priest to serve all the worship and pastoral needs of the parish. Thankfully, we have two wonderful deacons, Becky Williamson and Linda Hutson, and retired priests Judy Turberg, Ted Holt and Tom Neyland who help out and support our parish.

Activities have changed the last three years. Big events like the Tour of Homes may never return. So what can replace it to highlight our church in Green Valley and bring in money to support our ministries? What new and exciting projects can we start?

Worship is still in a time of transition. We have one service on a Sunday as a result of Covid19. However, as more people come forward to be Greeters, Ushers, Lectors, Acolytes, Altar Guild, and Audio Visual team members, we may eventually return to two services.

One positive change due to Covid19 is our Live streaming on YouTube. It helps us reach out to many members each week and has also become a way for new people to get to know us. Many have joined our parish because of our online presence.

We are a parish in transition as we continue to grow into the image of St. Francis of Assisi

by learning about Franciscan values and using those values as a way to measure what we do and believe; In how we welcome others, respect the environment, help people in need, and learn to be prophetic voices in our community and Diocese.

What will this year look like? So far 2023 is looking more like pre-Covid19. The snowbirds are returning in larger numbers. Sunday attendance is increasing as are the activities through the week by parish and user groups. Our building is busy seven days a week.

Transitions will continue as we introduce new social events, study groups, wellness programs such as a Parish Nurse Program and a support group for caregivers of people with dementia called Stress Busters. Other additions will include Creation Care/Green initiatives, and a look at new outreach ministries such as the Episcopal Peace Fellowship and the possibility of an after school children's literacy program for grade three students

Church has changed due to Covid19, yet we are blessed that St. Francis is growing. I believe we will continue to attract more of the retired folk in Green Valley as well as local families seeking baptisms and a church to raise their children. Now is the time to embrace the energy and excitement which will help us will set the pace and direction for the future as we look to our 60th anniversary in 2026.

So what can you do to help? We need you to get involved by bringing your ideas. You can volunteer to help out on Sundays in worship, the coffee time or the boutique. You can join committees or participate in various groups and ministries such as Stephen Ministry, Daughters of the King, Men's Group, Pastoral Visitors, the Choir, Bells and Saturday Worship Team.

All of what goes on at St. Francis in the Valley could not happen without dedicated volunteers, leaders and staff. There are too many names too mention, but I do want to say thank you to Deborah Harby, Gerald Near and Megan McAllister for keeping the office running. I also want to thank all the front desk volunteers for their presence in the office.

A special thank you to our Vestry Officers, Sr. Warden Julie Reppenhagen, Jr. Warden Kristi Menix, Vestry Clerk Bobbi Tucker, and our new Treasurer Gloria Cadwalader. Many thanks to our retired treasurer Erik Rinkjob who oversaw our books for five years!

It will be run by an outside facilitator and include time for prayer, meditation, and group sessions. It will be a time of renewal for everyone. Keep us in prayer.

Did you know that a National Day of Service called "Random Acts of Kindness" falls on Friday, February 17? Junior Warden's Notes

1. The Parish has hired a full-time Lead Sexton, Matthew Harby (32 hours + on call), and a part-time Seasonal Sexton, Nathaniel Martinez (10 - 12 hours, October - May). Please welcome Matthew and Nathaniel.

2. A special thank you to Craig Reid and Roger Hinterthuer, both dedicated parishioners and volunteers, and to many others for assisting temporarily with many of the usual sexton duties.

3. A local locksmith in the community is reworking the lock mechanism of the main entrance door into the Parish Hall.

4. Update on solving inefficient heating and cooling in choir loft: the problem is not leaking refrigerant, as earlier reported, After doing a systematic

and meticulous assessment of the entire system, the recommendation is the repair of several components. This repair work will be done in mid-January.

5. The deteriorated metal, floral fountain at the east entrance to the Courtyard will be removed soon. Tentatively, another fountain will be installed. The memorial plaque/small boulder will remain.

5. By January 15 donations toward the purchase of latching wrought iron gates for the entrances to the Courtyard have reached \$2920 (50% + of the cost); \$5400 is needed. Thank you to all who have donated so far. All donations are appreciated. The gates are designed to provide barriers to roving, destructive, and sometimes aggressive herds of javelina that frequently enter the Courtyard. For more information, please see the poster on the easel in the Parish Hall or contact Kristi Menix, Junior Warden or Father Warren, Rector.

6. Craig Reid and Reg Kahrimanis are coordinating teams of volunteer parishioners to continue establishing functional rock beds as well as improving the water collection pit in the northeast corner of the property. Completion of the trimming overgrown trees and shrubs is ongoing. Craig has applied pre-emergent to select ground areas for weed control. And, the necessary rain came on January 16 and continues as this is submitted for February publication! Thank you to all dedicated ground volunteers. Everything is looking great! Welcome Jon and Susan Burch, Harvey Eaves, Steve Huhta, and Susan Davis to the ground team.

7. To promote the safety of clergy and others who serve around the stairs of the altar area, another set of metal handrails is being considered. Stay tuned.

Scheduling At St. Francis

Ours is a busy place. Consider the following: in 2022 St. Francis saw 424 twelve-step group meetings. (2022 was a year still of recovery, i.e. not all such groups had returned to their full schedule of meetings.) Apart from twelve-step meetings we hosted 102 meetings of non-parish groups which met weekly or monthly. Add to all this 77 parish or parish-sponsored events and, again, ours is a busy place. Non-parish groups are required to fill out a form requesting meeting time and space; the information is then entered into our digital Master Calendar—a necessary bit of data entry that pre-

cludes the chaos of double-bookings (a recurrent nightmare).

Making our facilities available to the community is a long-standing and beneficial parish policy—beneficial for all concerned—which reflects the intent of our mission statement. But the ‘down side’—if there is one—is that parish groups too must formally request the use of time and space in parish facilities. The calendar (which looks unfortunately like Gerald) must be consulted before announcing a meeting or scheduling an event. And in all fairness we cannot expect outside groups to simply step aside to accommodate our wishes after we have promised them the use of time and space in our facilities (they also pay us—as best they can—for the chance to meet here at St. Francis).

If you are responsible for scheduling a parish event or meeting, please remember that the first link in the chain is to consult the calendar (that’s Gerald) and to, yes, fill out a request form. You can reach him via email at gerald@stfranciscgvaz.org
