Dear friends,

Happy New Year to you and your families. I hope your Christmas was filled with much joy and blessings!

The beginning of a new year allows us to start fresh, whether it is a resolution to do more to lose that extra holiday weight or a decision to get more involved in the community or our church.

One thing the church offers that the GVR doesn't is a chance to build up spiritual muscles. I would like to offer a bigger variety of studies based on what you would like to learn. I am also interested in starting some home study groups that can meet at times and places that can accommodate more people's schedules.

Have you ever led Bible or Church History studies at St. Francis or at previous churches? Please let me know. If you would like to be a host house for a study group of five to ten people, also let me know. I especially want to start a study or two in Sahuarita and Madeira Highlands neighborhoods. For those who work, I want to offer evening studies.

Franciscan Focus

For the next several newsletters instead of describing Franciscan values we'll be sharing stories of our members who are living them in our prison and border ministries. Here is Mary Staples' story.

"Thanks for inviting experiences from those of us who volunteer at the border. Sue Spiewak has been active in this work for years; my involvement is recent. Previously I volunteered at Casa Alitas in Tucson, serving lunch to asylum seekers once a week with a neighbor who has since moved away. I grew up in the UCC church with parents and a youth leader who taught us to stand against racism and for justice. The importance of these stances has stayed with me all these years.

"Sue Spiewak asked me a few months ago to go down to Nogales, Sonora with the group. My neighbor Susie Sanders (from Good Shepherd UCC) drove me across to visit Casa de Misericordia and one other shelter. Casa is an excellent shelter for many asylum seekers, sponsored by Cruzando Fronteras. Anyone interested in learning more about it should definitely visit there. Our Diocese helps keep Casa de Misericordia going through its financial support

"Anyway, I volunteer now on the AZ side, greeting people who have passed their Credible Fear interview with ICE and are headed to sponsors' homes in the U.S. Many families, even with young children, have walked from Venezuela. Some are from Africa, Europe, Cuba or Haiti. I greet them in Spanish and tell them briefly about Casa Alitas, which offers meals, a bed and assistance with securing air or bus transportation to their sponsors. Very few turn down this generous offer. So I walk them to the Casa Alitas Welcome Center a few

"The one person who stands out is an older woman from Chiapas, Mexico. She spoke little Spanish; her native language is one of the indigenous ones. A border patrol officer brought her to me and said, "this lady will need your special care." He had made contact with her daughter in S. Carolina and together they had made a plane reservation for her to fly there the next day. She was well under 5 feet tall, and she held my hand all the way until we reached the Welcome Center. She had witnessed killings by drug lords. I am thankful to have had a very very small part in helping her on her way to safety.

Junior Warden's Notes

•The Columbarium Brick repair (water intrusion rain cap), with impermeable cementitious coating and raised center, the placement of a site

drain with a Geotech Product is placed against the wall at the south side of the foundation wall and the white wash work has been completed. The total amount including materials plus tax: \$ 3,065.00 (Trust Funded). It should be re-sealed every 3 to 5 years.

•The stained-glass panels in the bell tower have sustained wear damage over time. The glass itself is okay for now but the lead frames have warped out of shape and need to be replaced. Lead was the original and traditional material used. Unfortunately, over time and summer heat, they are losing their shape. Zinc metal framing is the best choice for reframing and has a rigid strip giving them strength and a finished edge. (Will be asking the Trust Fund for help)
