## *From our Interim Rector . . .*

### **MORE ABOUT OUR SUNDAY PRAYERS**

I've had comments and inquiries about the Consecration Prayer we are using at the Sunday eucharists. I'm glad you're noticing! One of my goals as your Interim Rector is to broaden the congregation's experience beyond Prayer A, B, C and D, and Rite One, from the Prayer Book. Across the Episcopal Church nationwide, great creativity is being shown in composing and using original prayers which follow the lessons of the liturgical year, so that themes from each Sunday's lessons reverberate as we listen to the priest consecrate the elements at the altar.

Composers of the Consecration Prayers are Canon Samuel Wells, a priest in the Church of England presently serving as Vicar of St. Martin in the Fields Parish in Trafalgar Square, London; and the Reverend Abigail Kocher, a priest in the American Episcopal Church. In their book, *Eucharistic Prayers* published by Eerdmans, they have created prayers for our entire three-year cycle of the liturgical year—so, about 150 prayers.

With the permission of Bishop Jennifer Reddall, we are using these beautiful prayers at St. Francis as an experiment during this Interim to broaden the congregation's experience of liturgical worship with prayers which build on the themes of each Sunday's assigned scripture. The authors permit us to use the prayers orally in worship, but not to print them in the worship bulletin. You can order this elegant collection online for about \$30.

Our Prayers of the People also echo phrases from Sunday's lessons. They are composed by a gifted, creative priest and colleague of mine, Canon George Woodward. I have suspended use of the BCP forms during this Interim, but the experiment will end when a new rector begins his/her tenure at St. Francis.

### *From our Assistant Rector...*

The rock musician Grace Slick, who was in her heyday in the 1960s and 1970s, likes to say in her older years that it's not what you did that you regret, it's what you didn't do. Now, Grace did a lot of things that the rest of us might regret, but she has a point about regretting the things we haven't done.

The Confession of Sin we say every Sunday in our service of Holy Eucharist (and some of us say daily in Morning Prayer) also has something to say about things we've done and things we haven't. In it we acknowledge that we can sin both ways – by doing certain things, and by not doing other things – and we ask for God's mercy and forgiveness for both. And notice, next time you say the Confession, that we elaborate on the things we haven't done, not the things we have done, that we're sorry for. "We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves."

I've found myself reflecting a lot lately on the things I haven't done—the ways God calls me into action that I shy away from or just never get around to. When I think about them, I can see that so many of them are ways that I could have lived out loving my God and loving my neighbor. Taking action in the face of injustice. Helping someone who is sick or depressed or could just use a visit from a friend. Volunteering to take on a task that no one else has stepped up to do. Even spending time with family and friends – maintaining those important bonds.

Upon this kind of reflection, it's hard at first not to get down on yourself when you think about all the things you haven't done. There will always be many. But hidden in all this is an opportunity to turn one's response into a positive one. To think about and recognize the ways that God is calling you into action and to be intentional about how better to respond to God's call.

I've resolved to spend a little time every morning thinking about the ways that God might be calling me into action that day, so that I'm aware of when those instances arise – and I'm aware of what my instinctive responses are. So instead of just grumbling to my husband about what I read in the news, I might email my representatives or get involved with a group that's addressing the problem. If a family member asks me to do something I don't have time to do right away, I might see if I could do it later – or even say no but offer to do something else for them that I can do. I invite you, too, to think about ways that God might be calling you into action, and to practice new ways of responding in love.

## Rector Search Process

The members of the Rector Search Committee,—Mary Beth Bates, David Dunn, Janice Hall, Orji Isigogu, Bernie Ravenelle, Roger Williams, and Connie Wilt—have been meeting together for several months under the direction of BrandE Faupell, Committee Chair, and Kim DeMarco, Associate Chair.

A good deal of research has been put forth by the committee to develop several documents required by the Diocese, which subsequently are used to formally announce that St. Francis is actively seeking a new Rector.

One document is the Office for Transition Ministry's Ministry Portfolio, which provides interested candidates for the position of Rector at St. Francis, with a detailed description of St. Francis, its history, and the role we play in serving our parishioners, our community, and our dreams for the future. It easily tells a candidate if they would be a good fit with St. Francis. This document has been posted and candidate's names are being submitted. The general public does not have access to documents posted on this site.

A second document is the Parish Profile, which tells the St. Francis story in both words and pictures, focusing on what it is like to be a member of our faith community, how we serve the Lord, how we serve each other's needs and desires, and how we live as "Christ's heart and hands in the world." This Parish Profile is now a part of the St. Francis web site and can be found at: [https:// www.stfrancisgvaz.org/rector-search.html](https://www.stfrancisgvaz.org/rector-search.html). A much smaller version of the Parish Profile is a tri-fold brochure now in production, that will be used now and well into the future to tell the "St. Francis Story."

As you are reading this the Committee is busy with preparations to begin interviewing candidates, whose names will come directly from the Diocese, following an initial screening process. Should you have a name of a potential candidate, please forward that person's name directly to the Diocese, to the attention of the Canon to the Ordinary.
