From our Interim Rector . . .

Love the Liturgy

Nobody takes worship more seriously than Episcopalians. We want to be engaged by our scripture, our sermon, our music and our prayers. Something reported by participants in the Day of Discovery was desire for deeper engagement in worship. One gem of a response was Love the Liturgy.

So...as an interim experiment starting in May, let's worship with a consecration prayer which is individualized each Sunday by themes drawn from the scripture lessons for that Sunday. The form of the prayer stays the same: every Sunday there are four paragraphs in the consecration:

- 1. The first paragraph evokes one or two themes from the Sunday scripture.
 - It varies week to week.
- 2. The second, short, paragraph is the Sanctus; it is the same every week.
- 3. The third paragraph asks the Holy Spirit to bless the bread and wine as Christ's body and blood. No change.
- 4. The last paragraph applies the day's themes to current situations—among us, and throughout the world. It changes with the weekly lessons.

These prayers were created with great imagination and skill by Anglican priests Samuel Wells and Abigail Kocher. Invite God to open your heart and mind as you listen to these consecration prayers recall themes you've just heard in the readings, and which reinforce the thrust of the sermon. Then, as you are moved, let Pam and me know what you think!

From our Assistant Rector...

When I was called to ordained ministry and began my discernment process within the church, I was instructed to start meeting with a spiritual director and given the name of one in Sedona. Since I lived in Flagstaff, we agreed to meet at her cabin in Oak Creek Canyon, which was about the most beautiful place on the planet where one could experience spiritual direction! But I digress...

I've learned many important things through the spiritual direction I've received, but perhaps the most fundamental one is to pause frequently and ask myself, where is God in this? Where is God in what's happening right now in my life? When I'm struggling with a situation that's out of my control or not unfolding the way I anticipated, where is God in it? When I have to make a decision, where is God in that decision-making process? When I sit down to pray or when I prepare to lead a service, where is God in the prayer and worship?

It's easy to forget that God is present in everything we do, say and experience in our lives. We go about our busy days and so often think that we alone engineer what happens to us—and that we can dictate the outcomes. But we're in a partnership with God, whether we realize it or not. And it truly changes how we look at and experience our own lives when we live them in divine partnership instead of trying to tough them out as sole proprietors.

When I was in seminary, my spiritual director was an Episcopal priest who was a very wise and spiritually-gifted woman. She had a wonderful way of reminding me that I walked each moment of each day in partnership with God, and that my frustrations came from disregarding him. "I'm totally overwhelmed with school work and my internship and I don't have any time for my husband, my home life and my prayer life!" I would wail to her when we met. "Well, where's God in that?" she would ask me. "I don't know...nowhere," I'd reply, meaning it in an accusatory way. "Have you tried inviting him in?" she'd reply.

God stands ready and waiting for us to invite him into our lives. And it truly makes a difference when we do. The burdens we bear become lighter when we ask God to be present with us in the difficult parts of our lives, and the joys we experience are sweeter when we share them with him. And the first step in inviting God into our lives is figuring out when he's already present and when we've left him out. Consider asking yourself throughout the day, "Where is God in this?" and when your answer is "Nowhere," invite him in. See what shifts in your life when God is fully your partner, at work with you in your life.

New Faces at St. Francis

DEACON BECKY WILLIAMSON "There are many deacons in all parts of our diocese. Some of them may be aware and others may not have a clue—yet, regarding their ministry. I was in the latter category for many years. I have been a teacher, coach, counselor, social worker, Hospice Chaplain, and Spiritual Director during my work life. I was raised in the mountains of Wyoming and Colorado where I learned about the spiritual life in nature. All of this helped to formulate some concept of ministry through the 50+ years before my ordination.

"I kept feeling a call to something and had this call reflected to me by others, like my friends and priests. I considered everything other than ordained ministry—a new job, a Ph.D., anything else. The priesthood was not it either, although that was the only pathway known to me for many years. Nothing seemed to satisfy a desire that was in me but it still did not have a voice.

"Working in the Maricopa County Jail system as a Mental Health Counselor was a time when an idea of my ministry began to take shape. I sat with many inmates and found that I was often listening to inmates spiritual journeys. The desire to sit with others spiritually just would not be quiet, so I pursued something I was unable to define fully, but faith carried me through the ambiguity. My pathway was revealed and in spite of everything else, it made sense to me. My partner Sue's faith allowed her to trust it too. Funny that the obvious decision came when it did.

"Attending Spiritual Direction school for two years starting in 2008 and later, during Deacon Formation in 2009, and while attending Clinical Pastoral Education in 2011, I learned the gift of Holy Listening.

Rector Search Update

The Rector Search Committee has been meeting weekly since before the Day of Discovery (held March 16 at St. Francis). Based on all the input from parishioners on the Day of Discovery, the Search Committee has begun to write the Parish Profile and to answer numerous questions from the Office of Transitional Ministry at the National church offices. Each member of the Search Committee has agreed to write a portion of the Parish Profile, which we are now preparing to put into draft form as a full document describing the parish and what knowledge, skills and abilities we seek in a new priest. It has been an exciting few months of coalescing as a group and working with all the information that came out of the Day of Discovery.

When the Parish Profile is finalized and approved, it will be on the church web site as well as used by the Office of Transitional Ministry to advertise our open position. We are striving to have the profile in final draft form sometime in May, and approved in June. Once the position is advertised, the Diocese will begin to receive applications that will be passed onto the search committee for evaluation. The Search Committee has already begun to determine how applicants will be evaluated (also called a rubric, which is based on the information received at the Day of Discovery). The Committee will continue to meet weekly until the Parish Profile has been approved, and will resume meetings when applications are received.

Be An Honorary Grandparent

St. Francis is in the sixth year of its partnership with the Imago Dei Middle School in Tucson. This is our partnership ministry with one of the five Arizona Episcopal Schools, a member of the Southwestern Association and the National Association of Episcopal Schools. On 18 May last year we celebrated the graduation of nineteen 8th grade scholars, presenting each graduate with a \$100 Visa Gift Card. Attending graduation ceremonies at the Tucson Museum of Art were thirty-four members of our parish family along with Fr. Dan and Phyllis, and Rev. Pam and Doug.

This particular group, along with additional members of St. Francis, contributed toward the purchase of the gift cards. This spring's graduating class has 20 eighth grade scholars, and we invite you to share in recognizing their achievement by becoming an "Honorary Grandparent." continued from page 3 – New Faces "Then on January 29, 2011, I was ordained to the diaconate at Trinity Cathedral. I have never looked back and I thank God for the clarity of this ministry in the last decade while serving at St. Augustine's in Tempe.

"Happily for me, as someone who embraces change, the last 10 years of my life never have been the same year-to-year, and the understanding of my ministry has constantly evolved. Moving to Green Valley seemed a perfect fit for Sue and me. God was nudging us from the first visit and continued until we bought a home and moved here. It really was a 'God thing.'

"Working with older folks has been my ministry almost from childhood. Some of my best friends are in their second half of life and I am drawn to them like a magnet. I love listening to their stories about their lives with the realization that they have the same worries and concerns that affect us all.

"I believe I have felt freer to respond to gentle nudges by the Holy Spirit. My paid vocation (was then Hospice Chaplain) has informed and become a unified part of my diaconal ministry. Now that I am retired from the vocational world of work, I am thankful (almost) every day that I am allowed to serve as a deacon in God's mission in the world and I am extremely thankful to be serving at St. Francis in the Valley."
