Words From Warren . . .

Dear friends of St. Francis,

Lent, Holy Week, and Easter Sunday were a busy time at St. Francis in the Valley. Twenty-five people attended the studies offered in the Parish Hall led by Mike Kuebler, and another twenty-five attended the study on Forgiveness held in four different locations including La Posada, for a total of fifty people.

The evening study session showed that there is a need to run studies or events in the evening for people working through the day. When possible, we will continue to offer alternative times to include as many people as possible.

Three Wishes Feedback: The facilitators of the feedback sessions will be meeting with me shortly after this newsletter is printed, so more information of fall follow-up sessions to come.

In the meantime, some preliminary comments include more small groups for Bible studies, develop a strategic charting plan for development of the church's future, provide a Community Resource bulletin board, Food Basket suggestions and reminders in the bulletin, provide an area in the front of the church for disabled worshippers, the importance of the Eucharist each week, classes on how to use the Bible and how to use the BCP (Book of Common Prayer), bring a friend to church Sundays, and lots of comments on music.

Music is an area people would like to discuss. One idea I have had for a while is to put together a worship committee of three or four people to work with me, Deacon Becky and Gerald Near our Music Director. This committee will look at music variety and options as well as look at seasonal liturgies from resources such Enrich Our Worship (EOW), an Episcopal Church resource book.

One specific comment I do want to address directly is about some people feeling that the clergy are too busy to ask for time to talk. I want to be clear that while we are busy, meeting with someone who needs to talk or needs some counselling has always been a priority in addition to pastoral visitations.

If you, or someone you know needs to talk about some personal issues, please call or email me or Deacon Becky to set up an appointment. We are always available or will find a time and place to meet and talk.

With summer coming, I will be looking ahead to the fall to begin various home study groups as well as studies at the church. Please send me your requests on the kind of study you are interested in. We have several experienced study leaders that would be happy to include

your topic at some point through the year.

For those interested in learning the basics of the Bible, the Book of Common Prayer, and the Episcopal Church, there will be a class starting this fall in preparation for our Bishop's visit on Sunday, December 15.

The date for the start of this class will be in the next newsletter. The class will be for anyone interested in being Received or Confirmed into the Episcopal Church, as well as anyone just wanting to learn.

Finally a comment on Lent, Holy Week and Easter: Holy Week services had a similar attendance to 2023, but Easter Sunday hit a pre-pandemic high of 255 worshippers!

A special thank you to everyone who worked behind the scenes throughout Lent: Deacon Becky Williamson, The Altar Guild, the Social Activities Team who provided food for the Wednesday suppers, the Stations of the Cross leaders, the Ushers & Greeters, the acolytes, crucifers, lectors and prayer leaders, the Audio/Visual teams, the Sunday coffee teams, the choir and our organist Michael and Music director Gerald, and our sextons who set up and cleaned up after every event and service. I hope I didn't miss anyone!

As you can see, we have a very busy church and amazing volunteers. As we "Reimagine" St. Francis, the goal will be to build upon what we have and to be forward looking. There is much we do, but there is much more we can and need to do.

Upcoming: For those heading away on vacations or heading back north, we will see you when you get back. For those who will still be here in May, please come and welcome our Diocesan Canon to the Ordinary, Anita Braden, to our Pentecost Sunday Service May 19. Canon Anita will be our guest preacher. A meal will follow the service.

On Sunday May 26, we welcome back the local Sheriff's Auxiliary Honor Guard to our Memorial Day Sunday service on May 26. They will be doing the beautiful flag folding ceremony. Memorial/Remembrance poppies will be given to all who attend the service.

Franciscan Focus

St. Francis has long been involved in helping immigrants. In March, 2017, St. Francis' Immigration and Refugee Committee, working jointly with the Lutheran Social Services of the Southwest in Tucson, agreed to co-sponsor an Afghan family coming from the UN Refugee camp in Romania. The Lutheran Services found a two bedroom, one bath apartment in Tucson, and St. Francis' job was to totally furnish it. In four days' time, Committee members had everything in place, including food in the refrigerator. Over twenty St. Francis members met the family of five at the airport and took the father, Mohammad, age 80, and his four adult daughters, Soghra, Fatima, Marzia, and Razieh to their apartment in Tucson. (Airfare was \$1,000 per person which was provided to them by the Episcopal Migration Ministries, an interest-free loan, which they paid back.)

Through the years we have offered our support to the family in many, many ways: Helping Fatima find a specialist in Phoenix for a major spinal surgery in 2018; giving them sewing machines, computers and other devices; the women are all excellent seamstresses, and they made items we sold here in our Boutique. During the Pandemic, Razieh made over 200 masks, which were sold here. When they were able to buy a new home, in addition to money parishioners gave to purchase items for the house, more furniture was donated and we arranged for two trucks to deliver it. Also, ceiling fans were donated and installed in five rooms and a drip system installed in their backyard. All of this was received with much humility and appreciation by the family.

All the daughters have worked really hard from the beginning; only Fatima whose spinal surgery was successful in saving her life, is unable to work, but she assists Marzia with her sewing business at home. Soghra has worked many long hours at a hospital while taking

How to find a book

in the Parish Library collection

Did you know you can search for a book in the Parish Library through your computer at home? Here's how. Go to the Parish website (www.stfrancisgvaz.org), click on the option on the RIGHT side labeled EDUCATION, followed by clicking on the option LIBRARY. You are now on the LIBRARY Home Page. Scroll down to INSTRUCTIONS and click on LIBRARY search link where you will find all of the books in the collection. You can search for a particular book by Title, Author or Subject by using the box on the top upper left side of the page. Also, read the book titles scrolling across the bottom of the screen to find the latest additions. When you find what you want, make an informational note of it including your name, phone number, and the title and author of the book. Come in or call the office with your request. The library staff will take care of finding your request and notifying you when it will be available. Our collection includes many types of religious books, non-religious and novels.
