A Reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah (51:1-6).

Listen to me, you that pursue righteousness, you that seek the LORD. Look to the rock from which you were hewn, and to the quarry from which you were dug. Look to Abraham your father and to Sarah who bore you; for he was but one when I called him, but I blessed him and made him many. For the LORD will comfort Zion; he will comfort all her waste places, and will make her wilderness like Eden, her desert like the garden of the LORD; joy and gladness will be found in her, thanksgiving and the voice of song.

Listen to me, my people, and give heed to me, my nation; for a teaching will go out from me, and my justice for a light to the peoples. I will bring near my deliverance swiftly, my salvation has gone out and my arms will rule the peoples; the coastlands wait for me, and for my arm they hope. The Epistle

A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans (12:1-8).

I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect.

For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness.

THE SERMON: The Rev. Judith Turberg

THE NICENE CREED

e believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Celebrant God of all power, Ruler of the Universe, you are worthy of glory and praise.

Glory to you for ever and ever.

At your command all things came to be: the vast expanse of interstellar space, galaxies, suns, the planets in their courses, and this fragile earth, our island home.

By your will they were created and have their being.

From the primal elements you brought forth the human race, and blessed us with memory, reason, and skill. You made us the rulers of creation. But we turned against you, and betrayed your trust; and we turned against one another. Have mercy, Lord, for we are sinners in your sight.

Again and again, you called us to return. Through prophets and sages you revealed your righteous Law. And in the fullness of time you sent your only Son, born of a woman, to fulfill your Law, to open for us the way of freedom and peace. *By his blood, he reconciled us.*

By his wounds, we are healed.

to plant drought resistant plants and prepare water diversion systems. The "pond" is an excellent example of forward planning and implementation. Possibly, rain barrels to harvest roof runoff is next. Our organist Michael is playing two settings of the folksong 'Land of Rest' as his PRELUDE this morning, the second setting written by Gerald Near, an obscure American composer (still alive and living in Green Valley, according to rumor). My setting is the second movement of a three movement Suite for Organ published in 1966. The Suite is only the second work of mine published by a 'big name' publisher, again in 1966. (Michael takes fiendish delight in reminding me that he was only eight years old in 1966.) I'm happy to say the piece holds up reasonably well and is still in print. The original publisher was subsequently bought out by Belwin-Mills; they were in turn bought out by Columbia Pictures; the Columbia music catalogue was then bought out by Coca Cola and, at this writing, I've forgotten who owns it. Frankly, I don't care who writes the royalty check as long as my name's on it. *Gerald*
