Living St. Francis' Life and Values Right Here In Green Valley

In our continuing effort to define ourselves as Franciscans, the Stewardship committee under Fr. Warren's aegis gathered on several occasions this year to examine how our parish ministries reflect Franciscan values. The committee began by listing our ministries and also by noting how these ministries reflect Franciscan values. This was followed by an examination of how other St. Francis parishes, monasteries, religious orders, and universities, selected and interpreted Franciscan values. From our review of other Franciscan institutions and of our parish ministries we were able to delineate four Franciscan values for our parish:

1) COMPASSION. In short, this is the ability to look through each other's eyes so as to view the heart. Compassion was Francis' strongest personal trait and is largely recognized as so in Franciscan communities. Compassion, some say, is the greatest 'miracle' Francis performed.

2) SPIRITUALITY. Francis' life and work were directed uniquely to living closely with Christ himself. His spirituality was more than a reflection of holiness but rather a quest to subsume the very DNA of Christ.

3) CARE FOR CREATION. Francis had a reverence for all life forms (human, animal and vegetable) and for the total environment. In his CANTICLE OF CREATION, it is significant to note that Francis sees Christ as sharing existence with all life forms and also with inanimate creation such as fire, wind, water, Brother Sun, Sister Moon and all the cosmos.

4) PEACE AND JUSTICE. Francis saw that justice, and notably divine justice, exemplified in bearing the burdens of others, is a precondition for peace.

In future articles in the Newsletter, Fr. Tom and I will focus on each of these values in more detail, so as to provide an understanding of what it means to be Franciscan at St. Francis in the Valley. Peace and Good, *Vince Remillard*

(Francis' feast day is October 4, but the feast may be transferred to a Sunday for parishes named for the Saint.) The guest speaker will be our former Assistant to the Rector, The Rev. Pam Hyde, Canon for Creation Care, the Diocese of Arizona.

Junior Warden's Notes

Hello, to All! Hoping everyone is staying well and cool during these uncertain times that COVID 19 has wrought and the sometimes extreme monsoon rain patterns that have dispatched in our area!

♦Buildings

Heavy rains and hail in July damaged some roof tiles as well as portions of the flat roofs of our complex. Deborah Harby, Finance Officer and Office Manager, along with Deana Bond, Lead Sexton, have been working with a restoration company and insurance adjuster on a claim for the immediate and long-term repair work. The flat roof areas of damage have been repaired to prevent interior damage. The solar panels were evaluated and deemed undamaged by the recent hail.

Church Interiors

Seven sets of aging, deteriorating blinds have been replaced in the office complex.

One large, oil filled door hinge has been replaced on the door of the men's restroom in the office complex.

An upgraded audio-visual streaming system has

been installed in the Church Proper over the past 4-5 weeks. Tom Cadwalader, parishioner and volunteer project manager, has collaborated extensively and closely with RMK Productions. (Incidentally, RMK helped install the prior system.) New are cameras, microphones, cables, sound booth, and monitors; video streaming of services to include, for example, memorial services, can now be filmed in the Chapel and the Church proper. The outer finishing of the wooden, sound booth will match pew color and wood trim in the Church. Deana Bond, our talented Lead Sexton, is working on the booth finishing project. Training of additional videographers and sound board staff has occurred and is ongoing. Tom and Gloria Cadwalader have generously donated two chairs for the sound booth and will donate a small, locked, cabinet, too. Thank you Gloria and Tom.

It will be necessary to rent a lift to replace the burned out bulbs/lamps and remove and install new fixtures in the tall ceilings above the altar in the Church proper and in the Chapel. Fixtures and bulbs are being bid out and the cost of lifts explored. The intent of waiting to accomplish this electrical work was to use the lift for more than this one project, such as the installation of the new AV streaming system. We have learned that current lighting was not negatively affecting the quality of streaming, so we will proceed with new lights and fixtures as soon as possible.

The kitchen ice maker was recently evaluated and functions restored.

Exterior Spaces/Grounds

Many helpful hands cleaned up the storm debris from the recent winds, rain, and hail. Craig Reid and Reg Kahrimanis have maintained vigilance after storms to quickly identify serious damage to structures or the grounds. Until the monsoons are over, you may see collections of ground debris awaiting transport to the waste yard. The cost of a trip to the dump has risen from \$22 to \$25.

Because of the excellent rock and dirt work completed in the northeast, front of Church property, erosion from the rains has been minimal. Thanks go to Reg Kahrimanis and Craig Reid for their sustained, and substantial efforts. Also, note the rock berm on the north, small parking lot has been reworked to keep function and appearance. Thank you, Craig. All grounds volunteers are saluted for continuing their great beautification work: Chris Arundell, Gary La Barre, Arliene Stremming, Joyce Remillard, Vince Remillard, Fred Keller, Jack Ross, and Mark Stril. I regret if I have missed anyone.

An outside community member recently donated twenty five hours of community service to St. Francis. This individual worked with the supervision of Deana, Lead Sexton. Work done was blowing clean all asphalt parking lots and completing other miscellaneous and helpful tasks.

T and R Iron Works of Green Valley recently installed two sets of safety handrails. One offers support to those approaching the south Chapel entrance (\$1,062.63); the second offers support to those walking the sidewalk along handicapped parking on the upper, West parking lot (\$2,618.93).

Parishioners Gary & Pam Chambers have generously donated a mobile, collapsible tent, 10' x 10' approximately. It is suitable to provide shade and cover for Memorial Garden events or those held in other spaces. Deana can be contacted 36 hours in advance to install for events.

As things dry out, the installation of the 50-gallon cistern off the labyrinth will be completed. This serves as an accessible water source for watering plants and cleaning the labyrinth surfaces.

♦Miscellaneous

Print and copy paper previously stored in the Lead Sexton's office and storage area behind the kitchen has been moved to the unoccupied office in the office complex for easy access and management. The freed up space in the kitchen storage room will house the array of tablecloths previously stored in the Lead Sexton's office.

The Junior Warden is working collaboratively with Boutique Staff and a custom logo wear company to acquire polo shirts and T-shirts as well as matching caps for purchase by parishioners and others. Items will have the St. Francis logo, symbols, and inscriptions on them. Watch for a display of shirts and caps in the Parish Hall and eventual availability of items in the Boutique.

Rick's Pest Control continues to regularly exterminate outside the buildings and inside the Church and office/meeting rooms.
